F. F. Bruce: "The 'training and instruction of the Lord' would involve Christ's example, with due regard to his 'meekness and gentleness' (2 Cor. 10:1), as well as putting into practice his precepts."

"Children will more readily learn these lessons (the instructions of Christ) if the parents themselves show the way—by following Christ's example and practicing his precepts."
